From J20 M1

Whether you are approaching from the North or South, take the A4304 to Market Harborough.

As you enter the town on the Harborough Road, you will come to a roundabout - you need to take the first exit onto Coventry Road. You should pass the hospital on the left hand side. About half a mile later you should come to another roundabout. At this roundabout (BP petrol station in front of you, Catholic church on the left) turn left into Fairfield Road.

Follow this road right, left, then right again into Abbey Street. At the end of Abbey Street you should enter into a cobbled road (High Street, B6047). Turn left. Go past the Angel Hotel on your left and through the traffic controls.

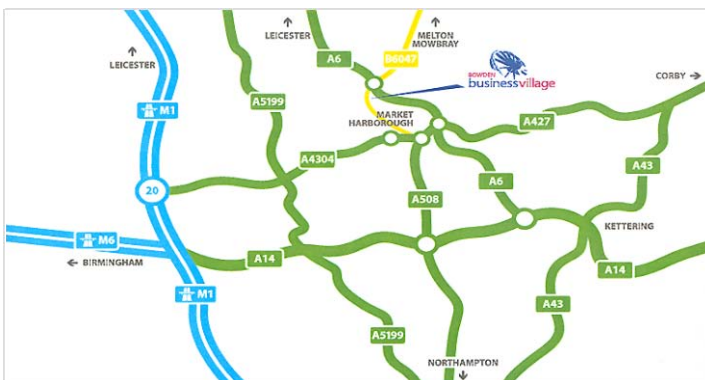
Follow this road (B6047 – Leicester Road – Harborough Road) for approximately one-and-a-half miles – just before the third roundabout (at the first two you should have gone straight on!) turn right into Bowden Business Village. **Please park in the first parking bay on your right.**

From the A14

Whether you are approaching from the East or West, leave the A14 at the junction signposted A6 North – Market Harborough, Leicester (junction 3). Follow this road for just over nine miles, continuing across the roundabouts and following signs for Leicester.

At the junction of the A6 and the B6047 (Jet petrol station, McDonalds) take the first exit from the roundabout and the entrance to Bowden Business Village is 100 metres on your left.

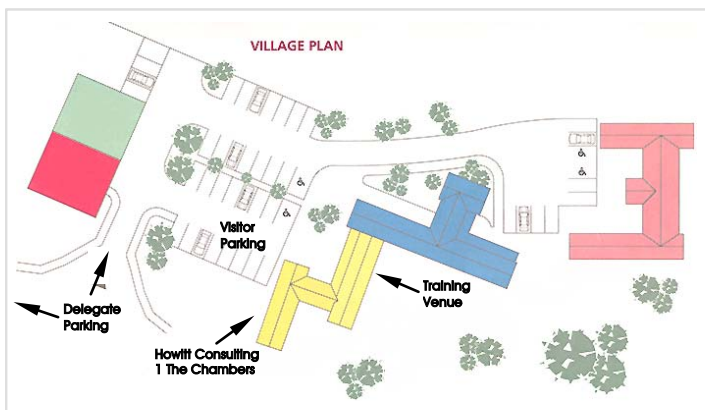
